WHAT DOES MOWOG MEAN? (Courtesy of St. Louis MG Car Club)

We have all seen the foundry mark on all the major components of BMC cars, but what in the world does it mean?

Here is the explanation according to David Doiron.

“MOWOG pre-dates the BMC merger. The Morris Garages in Oxford was the birthplace of the “Morris Garages Special”.

The name of the shop later became Morris-Wolseley Garages. The name “Morris-Wolseley Garages Special” was too awkward of a handle, so was the version “MOWOG Special”, so just the initials MG were kept and the word “Special” was dropped.

ALL parts boxes (as well as foundry marks) kept the MOWOG designation since parts went to far more cars than just MGs.

The foundry mark for Austins was the “flying A”.

When the BMC merger took place, there was an effort to use the BMC rosette as the new “marque”. It successfully replaced MOWOG on printed materials such as parts boxes, but it never really took hold as a foundry mark, and MOWOG remained the most common foundry mark on parts used for the Midget-Sprite series.”

2012 – THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE MG “B”

The first production MGB rolled out of the factory May 22nd, 1962. That was 50 years ago, and the model is still going strong. Production ceased in October 1980 when the parent company shuttered MG. An 18 year run, quite remarkable.

The MG Car Club, U.K., and the MG Owners Club, U.K. are planning through a joint venture, many celebrations honoring the “B”, including a day-long 50th Birthday

Party at Blenheim Palace, at Oxford, England, on Sunday, September 23rd, 2012. The Palace was the venue used for many of the early MGB photo shoots.

Since many of us will not be in Oxford for that event, the MG Car Club-Florida will be celebrating the “B” throughout the year.
